I would like to use this month's article to fill you in on a myriad of noteworthy issues that affect this radio ministry.



First, I want to update you on the progress of **Bigfoot**. A man came in and mentioned that he was in a business that normally has The Cornerstone playing. He said he asked them why they were not playing The Cornerstone. They responded that they are getting lousy reception. Next they complained that Cornerstone had "collected all this Bigfoot money and the signal is not any better."

Well, we have not turned on the power increase yet but when we do it will be dramatically better for listeners from Port Orange North to Marineland. All the money we raised for Bigfoot will be spent for Bigfoot. This is a very complicated process and is not as simple as buying a piece of equipment and turning it on. Feel free to call me and I will be happy to go into detail.

We have already jumped the main hurdle and that was the power increase. We are almost finished with the addition to the transmitter building to house the new

transmitter. For more reasons than we have space here, we are soon to order the antenna and transmitter. When we receive the equipment, we will hire a tower crew and install the antenna but while we are waiting for the antenna we will install the transmitter and all the electric. I am hoping to have this finished by late summer. Remember, it will all depend on the manufacturer's ability to get the equipment to us. We have been praying and working on this for 12 years and no one is more anxious to get this done than all of us.

Now, let me address the reception issue. A phenomenon that happens every spring especially when it is extremely dry is called skip. This is an atmospheric condition beyond our control. Skip gives us lousy reception especially in the mornings during the spring. If you tune around the dial you will see it is not just our signal that is affected. You might get a station from Miami and they may get us on the dial in Miami. Sometimes our satellite feeds give you a hiccup intermittently. You will get this on the news. These are all issues we cannot control. I do feel the power increase will help the bad reception for those who will listen to 90.3.

One other thing you may have noticed is that on some of the programs like Focus on the Family and Joni and Friends, you have to turn up the volume until it is over and then you have to turn it down. We are working on this but once again it is largely out of our control. Several months ago, the programmers collaborated to bring us a new

Recently I heard a priest quote Pope Benedict saying, "Anyone who does not know God is ultimately without hope". Where is your hope? Simply just knowing that there is a God is not enough. You have to have a relationship with Him. It is vital. There are many verses in the Bible about hope. My favorite verse, also happens to be my life verse, is Jeremiah 29:11. Recently my daughter shared with me that during her quiet time she studied the verses Jeremiah 29:11-13. She knew this was "my" verse so she shared with me what she had written in her journal. I asked her permission to share it with you.

Jeremiah 29:11-13 *"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call upon me and come and pray*

to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart..."

Dad's prayers for his only daughter to go to college. He was almost ready to retire when I surprised him by being born. I was a princess to him, but only to him. His family was not at all happy about my existence and didn't try to keep it a secret. They used to say "She will never amount to anything, just another high school dropout." He died when I was eight, long before I knew what the word college meant and even as late as my junior year, I had no plans for high education because I had no money. Last month I was privileged to be invited to the Basics 2009 conference at Parkside Church near Cleveland, Ohio. Alistair Begg is the Senior Pastor at Parkside Church and joining him this year in the 10th annual Basics conference were Dr. John Piper and Dr John Lennox.

Piper is known around the world for his powerful preaching and is also a distinguished author. Dr Lennox is a Professor of Mathematics in the University of Oxford. He lectures on Science and Religion in the University of Oxford and teaches at the Oxford Centre for Christian Apologetics. He debated Richard Dawkins on "The God Delusion" in Birmingham Alabama (2007) and on "Has Science buried God?" in the Oxford Museum of Natural History (2008). He has also debated Christopher Hitchens on the New Atheism (Edinburgh Festival 2008), and Michael Shermer and Victor Stenger in Australia. That being said, I was privileged to listen to three days of powerful preaching and teaching on the necessity of staying true to the clear proclamation of the Gospel. I was encouraged, edified, and challenged in my personal walk with Christ, as well as in my ministry at home, The Cornerstone and as Youth Pastor at Crosswalk Church in Daytona Beach.
